

Proposals to encourage pupils to travel actively to school in September





Travel Survey

- A third of all journeys prior to Covid-19 were made by children travelling to school. With 2m social distancing in place, capacity on London buses is around 15 per cent of pre-Covid-19 levels.
- Therefore, the Department of Education and Cabinet have asked local authorities to work with Schools to encourage pupils to travel actively and avoid public transport where possible.
- The Minister for Roads, Buses and Places has asked all Secondary School pupils are parents to complete a travel survey before the Summer Holidays – the Waltham Forest survey can be accessed here: <u>https://bit.ly/WFSchoolTravel2020</u>

Proposal background

Through the Enjoy Waltham Forest programme and the Behaviour Change Team's previous work with schools, we know there are barriers to pupils working and cycling to school:

- Confidence/knowledge of cycling,
- Bike maintenance,
- Bike security,
- Personal safety,
- Access to a bike,
- Knowledge of local area.
- Therefore, we have compiled a list of initiatives and resources to share with Schools to tackle overcoming these challenges.
- We are looking for input from staff and pupils on how we can deliver these proposals with the most impact and effect.





Pupil Focus Groups

- Waltham Forest Council Behaviour Change Team will be hosting focus group sessions with to discuss ideas on how to make it easier, safer and more fun to walk and cycle to school.
- We are interested in everyone's views, whether they previously walked or cycled to school or if they usually travel by public transport or car.
- There will be two sessions **tomorrow 10.30am-11.30am or 2pm-3pm** which pupils can take part in (there will be a maximum of 15 pupils per session to ensure everyone has a chance to participate).

Summer Opportunities

Summer Cycle School

- Pupils can attend a FREE Summer Cycle School to increase knowledge and confidence when cycling,
- Sessions will initially be held in Leyton Jubilee Park due to our existing bikes being located in a secure location – other locations could be considered,

Public Dr Bikes

- Dr Bikes are FREE to anyone who lives, works or studies in the borough,
- At Dr Bike sessions experienced mechanics check everything on your bike from • wheels, brakes, gears and tyre pressure to lights, racks, pedals, saddles and more,
- This could be a great opportunity for pupils and staff to have their cycles checked • over the summer before the term starts in September,
