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Introduction to Early Years System Support (EYSS)

Early Years System Support is a model which allows early years professionals to work with their peers to share knowledge and best practice, support each other and receive or deliver the advice and training required to delivery high quality childcare.

The Local Authority has a statutory duty to facilitate the provision of information, advice and training to early years and childcare providers.

Historically this has been delivered via LA employed staff or external providers commissioned by the LA. Following significant improvements in the Early Years and Childcare sector over the last few years, colleagues across the early years sector believe that the collective knowledge and expertise that now exists within the sector should be tapped into in order to continually improve quality. The Early Years System Support (EYSS) model will allow early years professionals to work with their peers to share knowledge and best practice, support each other and receive or deliver the advice and training required.

A budget allocation has been agreed by Schools Forum to facilitate this work.





EYSS Training Providers

The Local Authority commissioned EYSS training providers on behalf of the sector against the agreed criteria and EYSS budget. These EYSS training providers will then deliver the agreed training/support to Waltham Forest Early Years schools and Ofsted registered providers.

The criteria to be on an approved list of EYSS training /support providers are as follows:

- Current Early Years Inspection Ofsted of Outstanding
- Teaching school status in Waltham Forest or external.
- Early Years Specialist Leader in Education (SLE)

Training Guidance and Booking

Maximum Number of Attendees per Setting To ensure that training is accessible to all LBWF settings/schools, all trainings will stipulate the maximum number of attendees allowed per setting. This may be 1 delegate per setting or a maximum of 2delegates.

How to book your training

All trainings can be booked on a first come first served basis through the <u>online booking system</u>. Checking your bookings

Once you have received your booking confirmation, you are responsible for checking that the information is accurate and alert the service to any errors.

How to cancel and amend your booking

For **fee paying courses**, in order to cancel your booking without charge you will need to provide a **minimum of 7days notice** before the date of the course. We will not actively seek an alternate candidate for a place cancelled within 7 days of the course but where there is a waiting list and we are able to fill the cancelled place we will waive the cancellation fee.

Fees

The course fees and training packages will be stated on each advertised course. Fees for settings registered with Ofsted within London Borough of Waltham Forest may vary from fees for proposed settings and external settings in some training.

How to Pay

Settings (Schools, Nurseries, Pre-Schools) registered in Waltham Forest will be invoiced for payment by the Traded services team once training has been checked out of the shopping basket. This will typically be the following calendar month. Early Years settings will also have the option to pay by card should they wish to.

Childminders registered within the local authority, proposed Childminders and external settings will ONLY be able to make payment by card when booking fee paying trainings. If you need further advice on paying your invoice, please contact wftsfinance@walthamforest.gov.uk

Please note that failure to pay for invoices will prevent you from booking onto further trainings.

Arrivals

Beyond Monitoring in Early Years

Course Description

Beyond Monitoring in the Early Years is a two part course designed to empower Leaders and Managers in Early Years settings with the means to secure better teaching and learning across their settings.

Course Outline

By the end of this course, Early Years leaders and managers will have the means to develop a bespoke system in their setting for improving teaching and learning that meets the needs of their setting. The original course was developed by two outstanding leaders in education and has been used by the DFE to raise standards in a range of settings.

The course is split into two separate sessions with practical tasks in between. Each day involves practical activities that provide opportunities to develop strategies in observation and reviewing outcomes in an Early Years setting.

Review how effective intentions for learning are in your setting Scrutinise the impact practitioners have on enabling outcomes for children in your setting

Children learn by leading their own play and by taking part in play which is guided by adults". Our intent is to help leaders of provisions with nursery age children to support staff teams to get the very best out of learning through play. This half day course is a hands on experience at Church Hill Nursery School, to observe, discuss and plan next steps for implementing professional development.
