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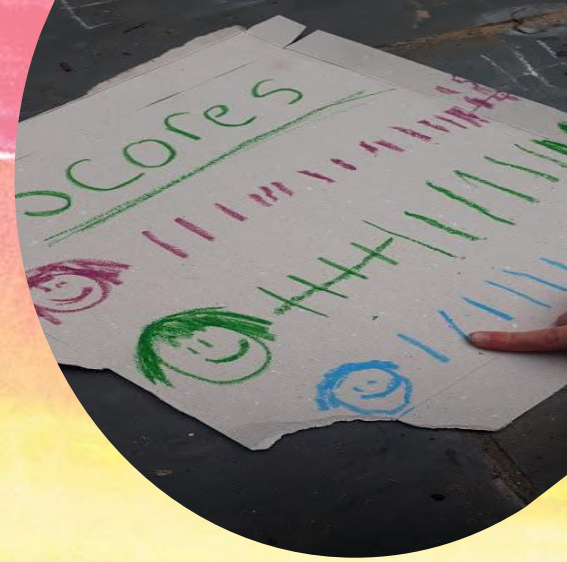
# Learning Together Counting Together

Let's pretend to go shopping!

We can set up a shop with my toys, using some coins and make price tags with tiny bits of paper.

**Did you know?**

Role play, cooking or shopping with children will help them learn mathematical words such as lots, empty, full, more than, less than.



**How you can help me...**  
Give me things to explore and count like crumpled up foil, milk bottle tops, cardboard tubes or leaves. I could sell these in my shop.

**What I like to do...**  
Pretend to do things adults do such as buying and selling items for money.
