What is on offer for 2-year-olds?

15 hours free childcare

Almost a quarter of families with a 2-year-old child can claim up to **15 hours** of Free Early Education Entitlement (FEEE) per week during term time or 570 hours across the year. Apply now at:

walthamforest.gov.uk/ childcare

Create your account and apply online to get your eligibility code and letter, take it along with your child's birth certificate to your school or childcare provider. Only providers with a Good or Outstanding Ofsted rating can provide FEEE places.

Your 2-year-old will be eligible if your family gets one of the following benefits:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
- Universal Credit, and your household income is £15,400 a year or less after tax
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit (or both), and your household income is £16,190 a year or less before tax
- the Working Tax Credit 4 week run on

If you're not receiving any benefits, your 2-year-old can qualify if they:

- have an Education, Health and Care plan (EHC plan)
- get Disability Living Allowance (DLA)
- are looked after by a local authority or have left care under a special guardianship order, child arrangement order or adoption order in England or Wales.

If you're a non-EEA citizen who cannot claim benefits and your immigration status says you have 'no recourse to public funds', you may still get free childcare for your 2 year old if your household income is no more than:

- £34,500 for families within London with one child
- £38,600 for families within London with two or more children

What is on offer for 3 & 4 year olds?

15 hours free childcare and early learning from the term after your child turns 3

All families are entitled to 15 hours of free childcare and early learning per week term time, or 570 hours across the whole year. Just contact your preferred school or childcare provider to apply directly. Contact the Childcare Team for assistance in finding a place, or visit the Childcare Directory at: walthamforest.gov.uk/childcare

30 hours free childcare

Working families (including foster families*) earning at least £152 a week or more could get an extra 15 hours of free childcare – a total of 30 hours per week term time or 1140 hours across the whole year. * Subject to foster child's care plan

Tax-free childcare from 0-12*

Working families in the UK with children under 12 (*or under 17 if disabled) can apply. For every £8 you pay in, the government will add an extra £2, up to £2,000 per child per year, or £4,000 per year for a child registered as disabled.

Important

If you're claiming 30 hours* free childcare, **you must apply and receive your eligibility code before the term begins.** If you do not get this in time, you will need to wait until the next term. 30 hour codes need reconfirming every three months.

Did you know that ...?

In August 2022 95% of childcare providers in Waltham Forest are rated Good or Outstanding by Ofsted.

Find local registered school, nurseries, pre-schools or childminders on our Childcare Directory at: walthamforest.gov.uk/childcare

Contact your chosen childcare provider, find out if they have places available and arrange a visit. If you like them and want to register, show them your:

- child's birth certificate or passport
- eligibility code (if applicable)
- National Insurance number

Arrange a start date for your child to enjoy their free place! You can split the hours between two childcare providers if necessary.

What if I want to use more or fewer hours?

You don't have to use all free hours you are entitled to. If you only want your child to go for a few hours a week, that's okay. You can also pay for extra hours if you need! Please discuss with your childcare provider.

Did you know that ...?

You can stretch your free hours over 52 weeks and also use them during school holidays.

I'm not sure if my child is ready

You can take your child to a number of free Story and Play sessions provided as part of the Best Start in Life Offer. For more details, see the "What else is available for children under 5?" section.



When to apply?

All children are eligible for 15 hours of free childcare, (or 30 hours if eligible) from the term after they turn 3.

If your child is eligible for the 2 year old funding, then they can start the term after they turn 2. Find out from your chosen provider how and when to apply.

1st January – 31st March	1st April
1st September – 31st December	1st January

Did you know that ...?

Waiting lists can be long, it is good idea to start looking for childcare 6 to 12 months in advance.
